Daniel attributes most leadership crises to failure in one of the following areas: Current Reality, Vision, Midterm Planning [Gap Management] and maintaining a 90-Day Business Plan. In your current business model, do you have all of these in place?

Daniel states that Vision is always bigger than the product we offer of the service we provide. Do you concur?

Daniel suggests that a lack of clear compelling vision, or a failure to consistently communicate it often leads to failure. Do you concur?

Daniel gives three subsets to the concept of vision that energize and pull people into a Vision. People want to: 1. Belong [be a vital part of a team or community], 2 Become better [greater than they are] and 3. Build something. Does your workplace offer these? If not, what do you think the impact would be if they were prominent?
